- Demonstrable commitment to continuing professional development
- Clinical experience in the UK
- Delivery of postgraduate and other relevant teaching
- Specialist clinical / professional experience in the relevant field
- Active involvement in teaching ophthalmology
- Ability to communicate using good written and verbal skills with all stakeholders, eg: learners, educators and colleagues
- Ability to work to tight timescales
- Video editing skills are desirable but not essential
