The purpose of the Training The Trainers (TTT) subcommittee to develop and coordinate the provision of the Training The Trainers programme for the College and its members. It is accountable to the Education Committee. The Chair of the TTT subcommittee is a member of the Education Committee.

The TTT programme currently includes courses for Trainees, Supervisors, College Tutors, OPT, Surgical, and Advanced Trainers and Educators.

As Chair you will oversee the delivery of the TTT programme by the members of the subcommittee and have responsibility for ensuring that the Education Committee performs its duties set out in its Terms of Reference, as well as supporting and giving guidance to the members of the Sub-committee.
